




The event concluded with a sense of accomplishment for both the participants and organizers, contributing to the intellectual growth and academic spirit at ITS, Ghaziabad.

Session 1: Mr. Shiv Sharma - Power BI, Low-Code/No-Code Development, and AI Tools



Mr. Shiv Sharma initiated the session by discussing the following core topics:

- **Power BI**: He provided an overview of Power BI, emphasizing its capabilities in data visualization and business intelligence.
- Low-Code/No-Code Development: Mr. Sharma explained the concept of low-code/no-code development, focusing on how it simplifies application creation without writing traditional code. He discussed tools like Power Apps and Power Automate for creating intuitive applications with minimal coding.
 - Use of SharePoint as a Connector: One of the examples demonstrated was using SharePoint as a connector in Power Apps to manage data effectively. He explained how drag-and-drop features could be used to create user-friendly interfaces.
- Challenges of Traditional Coding: Mr. Sharma also highlighted the challenges faced in traditional coding and how low-code/no-code tools can significantly reduce development time and complexity.
- **Al Development**: He suggested Python as an ideal starting point for those interested in Al development, especially for automating processes and optimizing workflows.
- **Power Automate**: A demonstration was given on how Power Automate can be used to create automated reminders and notifications for users.
- **Database Management**: He elaborated on the role of databases like SharePoint and Dataverse in data management and integration.

Mr. Sharma also discussed the AI & Copilot Journey, detailing how AI tools like AI Builder are evolving, from text recognition and facial recognition to speech and security-related applications. He provided examples of practical implementation in Azure, showcasing how AI tools can enhance user experiences through text, face, and voice recognition.

Session 2: Mr. Satoshi Nakamoto - Blockchain Technology and its Applications, Crypto currency, VR, AR, MR.
